6. Statement of Research Interest

Previously, I have investigated the asymmetry of language dominance in the brain and its relationship with handedness preferences. Additionally, I investigated how language dominance is represented structurally using MRI diffusion imaging techniques such as DSI (diffusion spectrum imaging) to examine and visualise white matter pathways.

My current research interests lie in the field of social experimental psychology, specifically focusing on intentionality. My research centres on social intentionality, responsibility and the psychological factors associated with it. I have utilised quantitative research methods and have developed, run, and analysed pre-registered experimental lab and online studies using questionnaires and surveys (SuperLab, Qualtrics, Jisc Online Surveys, Prolific, FormR, etc.). My analyses primarily consist of cumulative link mixed models constructed using R in RStudio. All of my current research is fully embedded within the Open Research ethos. Studies are preregistered, and data, materials and code are openly available on the Open Science Framework.

I have been involved with collaborative research projects and am currently fostering professional relationships to continue with this team approach to research. I intend to continue working collaboratively within and across institutions as part of my publication strategy to develop my track record of peer-reviewed and REF returnable publications.
